HIGHLIGHTS ROSETTA STONE STORIES

In Rosetta Stone stories, students can listen and read along to a native speaker narrating a story, or record themselves reading the story and listen back. The “Speak” section is a great way for new students to practice recording themselves because they don’t have to think about what to say but still get practice speaking. TRY THIS! WRITING WINDOWS
